From Greg Jones:

"I started playing bluegrass in San Francisco about 10 years ago. Faith Petric, known as one of the keystones in SF's bluegrass/folk community has had a jam going at her house for over 45 years (she is now over 80!) and I began attending these Friday evening jams. I became more involved with the Bluegrass community in the Bay Area and was asked to join the Board of Directors for the N. California Bluegrass Association."

"My current involvement with CTBA has been mostly attending the Sunday jam at Artz and the Thursday evening jam. I would like to become more involved with helping bluegrass in the Austin area move out of the "underground" status it now holds to the more mainstream status it enjoys in most other metropolitan areas in the country. I would like to see us set up more jams in conjunction with other bluegrass communities in the Austin area, and promote them to the greater Austin community."

"I play a little guitar, sing (poorly), play Jews harp and harmonica."

From Howard Hackney:

"I have always loved bluegrass and traditional acoustic music in general, however, I had been playing in electric bands for some time when after a practice, my ears were ringing so hard I decided I was going to start playing acoustic music exclusively for myself. By a natural progression of learning fiddle tunes and listening to more and more bluegrass music, I found myself immersed in it."

"I have only recently joined CTBA with the band to which I belong, Cedar Fever. I initially heard about CTBA through Eddie Collins while I was taking lessons. I am also taking over the creation of the CTBA newsletter due in part to my experience in layout, design and publication printing. I'm really excited about publishing the newsletter (is that normal?)."

"I see membership as a priority for CTBA, getting more people involved. Bluegrass is really blossoming in Central Texas and now is an excellent time to take advantage of the public interest. I also would like to see more Festivals in Texas and CTBA involvement in the festivals, that is the best way to bring the big names in bluegrass to our state and to our area."

"I play mandolin and guitar and like to sing. Whether or not I'm any good I can't say, but I'll tell you I'm better than I was when I started!"

NASHVILLE GUITAR WORKSHOP

Nashville Guitar Company is hosting its first annual guitar workshop November 15, 2003. The three instructors, Roy Curry, Scott Fore and Adam Wright are National Champions at Winfield, KS and together have won dozens of contests. Not only are they great musicians, but they have spent years sharing and teaching the art of flatpicking guitar. They are experienced teachers and conduct workshops suitable for all levels of guitar playing, from beginning to advanced.

Presented by Marty and Charmaine Lanham of NGC, this will be the first workshop of its type for flatpick guitarists in Nashville. We are quite excited to have players come to such a musical city. Since most of the traveling musicians are off the road by November, we are expecting drop in guests. For example, at our home/shop in Nashville, we often visit with Robert Bowlin, Pat Enright (NBB), Shad Cobb, Charlie Cushman (Mike Snider Band), and many other folks who come by the house whenever Marty strings up a new guitar, checking it out before it gets shipped to the owner. We visit, play music, and Oh Boy, you would not believe some of the notes played over the decades in this old farmhouse in Nashville. We feel honored to hang out with countless musicians coming through our guitar shop and our life.

There is a certain magic in Nashville because large numbers of musicians make their homes here. The Nashville Community is dense with virtuosity. The air is almost electric with energy from the music that surrounds us.

The workshops will be held at the Nashville Jazz Workshop facility, which is located on the site of an historic plant whose buildings are being restored, on the Cumberland River in downtown Nashville. The space features three classrooms and an 80-seat performance room. Classes are scheduled from 10am-5pm, with food catered on site. After workshops special guest guitarists will perform in the Jazz Workshop performance room, providing a wonderful setting to experience acoustic music.

Later in the evening, we will move to the World Famous Station Inn for performances by workshop participants and instructors from 7-9pm. Guest performers for the later evening will be some of the best of Nashville's flatpickers and singers whose vocal styles are defined by the acoustic guitar.

BABA FESTIVAL NEWS

The Bay Area Bluegrass Association has moved their festival site in 2004 and changed the dates. In 2004 our Fire on the Strings Festival will be held at HAVEN'S LANDING RV RESORT in Conroe/Montgomery. Located on FM105, 13 miles from I45, across from Lake Conroe, Haven's Landing RV Resort provides us with "rain or shine" facilities with air conditioned seating for 1000+ bluegrass fans. The 2004 festival dates are April 30, May 1 and May 2

Haven's Landing Resort has a huge air conditioned grand ballroom with elevated stage, concert lighting and excellent acoustics. The massive layout includes over 200 full rv sites, several club houses, a centrally located stocked lake with 25 private cabins that sleep 4 to 6 persons, as well as elaborate outdoor facilities including swimming pool with 2 jacuzzis, playground, tennis courts, and many bathroom and shower scattered conveniently throughout the park.

With our two Texas State contests (banjo and flatpicking guitar) and a possible third on the horizon, the BABA Board of Directors voted unanimously to move to Haven's Landing which will accommodate many more campers, jammers, and fans than in previous years.
