Weird Acoustic Music by Tyler Balthrop

Danny Barnes could easily be recognized as one of the weirdest people to play acoustic music. The fact is, he is an amazing musician, and his strange thoughts will be forever saved on record. It's the story of a small-town Texas boy who made his own dreams... and then lived them.

Born in Temple, TX, Danny grew up in nearby Belton, and was attracted to music at an early age. His grandmother listened to Flatt and Scruggs, and his father played a little banjo. His brothers introduced him to other styles like Delta blues and punk rock, and his eldest brother even built a "home-studio" out back.

Tinkering in his brothers' studio taught Danny that there was much more to recording than just performing music. He developed an interest every aspect of music

production, and in 1985, he received a degree in Audio Production from the University of Texas. And thus began the long line of weirdness.

Taking to heart the "play anything with strings" philosophy of idol John Hartford, Danny worked to create his own style of music, a style made up of all the different genres that he loved. Bluegrass melted with punk, which spilled over into the blues, all of which complemented Danny's sense of humor. It was his own personal brand of music, but others would soon come to enjoy it as well.

In 1990, Danny formed the neo-Bluegrass trio 'the Bad livers' with bassist Mark Rubin and fiddler/banjoist Ralph

White. This unique blend of acoustic music became an instant phenom, and they accredited three successful albums. Eventually, Danny left the 'Livers', and Austin in 1997, looking for a change of pace on the west coast. He found it.

Now living in Washington state, Danny flies as a licensed pilot, skateboards, rides a unicycle, and plays disc golf among many other things. He still makes his own brand of music, and it's possibly some of his best yet. One of his recent projects, 'the Old Codgers' formed in 2000, and has enjoyed critical success with their debut album 'Things I Done Wrong'. Danny will no doubt continue to perform, record, and invent weird acoustic music. Be weird, and listen to it. 🎵
