Troubled Waters

Half Mile Down The Road

This is the first release by Troubled Waters, a group from Indiana. Although new to Bluegrass as a band, each member has been involved in Bluegrass for many years. Dave Denman (guitar, fiddle, lead and harmony vocals) is best known for his earlier work with Allison Krauss & Union Station in the mid 1980's. Having a smooth vocal style and a polished lead guitar style, Alison Krauss even referred to him as "Bluegrass' best kept secret." John Pennell (bass) is also a former member of Allison Krauss & Union Station. Kent Todd (fiddle, lead & harmony vocals) A talented fiddle player, he previously performed with Gary Brewer & The Kentucky Ramblers in the late 90's. Bruce Booher (mandolin, lead and harmony vocals) A former member of the Texas band Borderline, along with other local bands. Klint Brown (banjo, dobro, lead and harmony vocals) He has been playing banjo since the age of 13, and is also a member of New Harmony, winners of the Bean Blossom Band Contest in 2001.



'Half Mile Down The Road' features a nice mixture of contemporary and traditional Bluegrass material. Some of my favorites from this recording are "Pig In A Pen" (arranged here in a slower, almost bluesy tempo), "Poor Ellen Smith"; the John Pennell original "Half Mile Down The Road", David Denman's original instrumental "Fourth Fret Logic,, and the Don Williams classic "Till The Rivers All Run Dry. This CD would be a welcome addition to any Bluegrass collection.

CTBA Promotes Bluegrass at Laurel Mountain Elementary

A First-Hand Report by Steve Davidson and Marty Hurt

CTBA's Bluegrass in School Program finished out the school year by participating in Pioneer Day at Laurel Mountain Elementary School in Northwest Austin. CTBA President Steve Davidson and Marty Hurt, entertained six different class groups of third graders (about 120 lively youngsters in all) as one of several activity stations the kids rotated through for Pioneer Day. Many of the children came decked out for the day in pioneer outfits complete with cowboy hats and bonnets.

Marty immediately got the kids involved by asking them questions about their study of the pioneers—where the first immigrants to our nation came from, why they came to the New World, and what they brought from their homes in the British Isles and Europe—specifically their musical traditions. Steve filled in with stories about his family's roots in the Panhandle of Texas and the enduring legacy of music that went from Irish/English to American Roots and finally to Bluegrass in the 1950's. The kids were interested in Marty's mandolin and Steve's guitar and were anxious to talk about the musical instruments they themselves are learning to play. We explained that we are pretty much beginners on our instruments, and they patiently endured as we played a few songs for them-



-The Snowflake Reel, Blackberry Blossom, and Red Haired Boy. In between discussion and music "sets," we showed a few segments of the IBMA's Discover Bluegrass DVD, and the kids were impressed to see two youngsters just a little older than, Sierra Hull and Ryan Holladay, burning it up on Bluegrass mandolin and banjo (especially after listening to us play!)

The Discover Bluegrass DVD features Rhonda Vincent, The Chapmans, Alison Krauss + Union Station, and The Special Consensus. This DVD introduces young viewers to the joyful and uniquely American genre of acoustic roots music. Discover Bluegrass is extremely well done, informative and geared to a middle school age audience, and the kids really enjoyed learning about Bluegrass instruments and

watching the performances of rising Bluegrass stars Sierra Hull and Ryan Holladay.

Personal note: Even though we were pretty anxious about our first community service "gig," once we got into it, we found the experience to be lots of fun, and truly rewarding for all ages and levels of musicality—what Bluegrass is all about. I hope you will take the opportunity to participate in a Bluegrass in School Program someday.
