The Grassy Knoll Boys is a classic bluegrass quintet with tight 3-part harmonies, plenty of instrumental chops, and an edgy repertoire of bluegrass originals and lesser known hillbilly, blues, gospel, and work tunes.



The band was born when Austin native Will Walden (guitar, lead vocals) met recent arrival David Hamburger (Dobro, vocals) and insisted that they form a band immediately. David has toured with Joan Baez and writes for Acoustic Guitar Magazine. Alex Rueb is on mandolin and vocals with Vance Hazen on bass. Two-time Texas State Banjo Champion, Brent Warnock, has recently joined the group. Their breakout CD, *Buckeyed Rabbit*, has received national attention. The Live Oak Coffeehouse Concert series is a great non-smoking, non-alcohol concert environment in North Austin. Larry Sparks recorded this album in 2000, with the help of Scott Napier (mandolin, harmony vocals), Josh McMurry (banjo), Virgil Bowlin (bass, harmony vocals), and Joe Clark (bass on 3 of the selections).

For those not familiar with Larry Sparks, he's a long-time bluegrass veteran, starting out in the late 60's with none other than the Stanley brothers, and would step in as the lead vocalist after Carter Stanley's death. In 1969, he started his own band, the Lonesome Ramblers. Since that time he has recorded 29 albums, and has won the IBMA Male Vocalist Of The Year award in 2004 and 2005.

Larry is well known throughout bluegrass for his forceful guitar style (listen to his version of the classic "Carter's Blues"), and his unique voice on classics such as 'John Deer Tractor', 'Brand New Broken Heart', just to name a few.

Highlights of this recording include two Gary Ferguson compositions, 'Timberline', and 'The Undelivered Message'; as well as an instrumental version of 'San Antonio Rose'. Without question, my favorite song on the CD would have to be 'Ghost Stories', a moving song that tells the story of a man discovering old houses, and thinking of all the people that once lived there

This CD has quickly become a favorite of mine, one

that I would recommend to anyone.

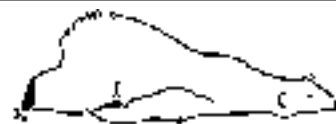


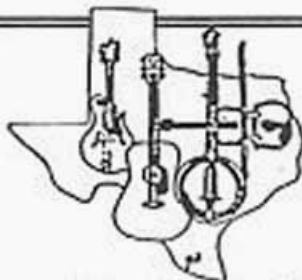
Steve Kaufman's Annual Two-day Guitar Workshop

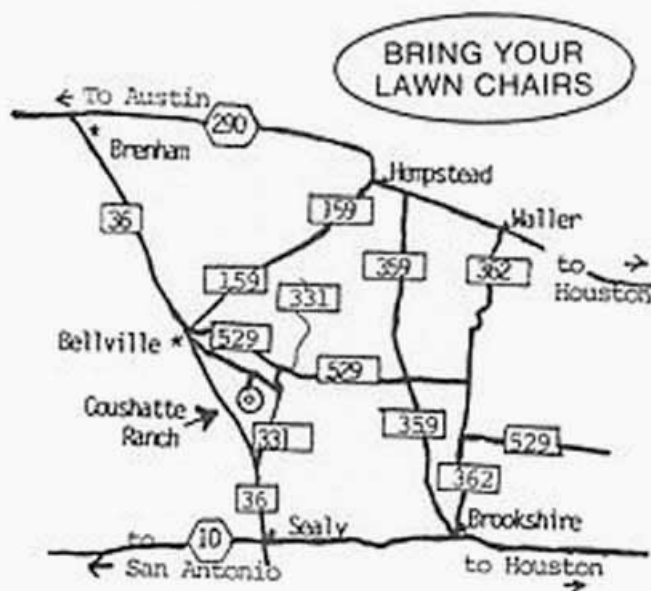

Bill Monroe Commemorative Stamp Campaign

Would you like to see Bill Monroe, the Father of Bluegrass Music, honored by a commemorative United States Postage Stamp? If you would, the time to act is NOW, and all you have to do is to write and mail a letter.

Each year the United States Postal Service considers the issuance of approximately twenty five commemorative postage stamps. Under its guidelines, the honoree must have been deceased for at least ten years, which in Bill Monroe's case will be September 9, 2006. The 95th anniversary of his birth, September 13, 2006, would be a logical date for the issuance of the stamp.

The first step is for a citizens' committee to select, and narrow down to approximately twenty five, the worthy nominees for each year. They do this by considering letters, cards, petitions, etc., sent to them by the public at large. After that the committee considers art work and other details for the stamp. Because Bill Monroe's music is appreciated worldwide, nominations from outside the USA

would be very appropriate. If you would like to participate in this effort on behalf of a great American musical genius, write your letter to:

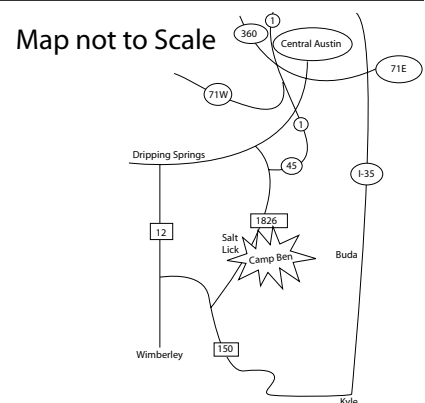
